





- ➤ The Marriott Hotel & Conference Centre faces the Brussels Stock Exchange («La Bourse»): it's a mere 5 minute-walk from the Brussels Grand-Place and the De Brouckere Metro Station
- ► From the Eurostar/Thalys Station = Brussels Midi: Two light-rail "City-Trams" will take you directly (12 minute-journey) to De Brouckere Station = a mere 5 minute-walk from the Conference Center TramLine-s 3 & 4; Metro & Tram Ticket price = 2. €
- ➤ The **cab-ride** from the **Eurostar Terminal** to the Conference Centre : can take **5 15 minutes** depending on traffic

Cost = **10.** € on average (may vary in the 7 – 15 € price range, depending on traffic)
